

NEW TEEN DRIVER LAW

EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 24, 2011



Currently

Learner's Permit

- Issued at 16 years of age
- Must be accompany by a licensed driver 21 years of age or older
- At least 50 hours of training

Junior Driver's License

- No driving between 11 P.M. - 5 A.M.
- No more passengers than seat belts
- May receive a Regular Driver's License at 18 years of age or if you have:
 - Passed a driver training course approved by the PA Department of Education
 - Had 12 months without a crash or driving violation conviction
 - Consent of your parent, guardian, person in loco parentis or spouse, who is at least 18 years of age

Effective December 24, 2011

Learner's Permit

- Issued at 16 years of age
- Must be accompany by a licensed driver 21 years of age or older
- At least 65 hours of training, 10 must be at night, 5 must be in bad weather

Junior Driver's License

- No driving between 11 P.M. - 5 A.M.
- For the first 6 months, no more than one passenger under the age of 18 unless:
 - They are in your immediate family and live with you
 - Your parent or guardian is in the vehicle
- May have up to three passenger who are under the age of 18
- May receive a Regular Driver's License at 18 years of age or if you have:
 - Passed a driver training course approved by the PA Department of Education
 - Had 12 months without a crash or driving violation conviction
 - Consent of your parent, guardian, person in loco parentis or spouse, who is at least 18 years of age

NOTE: If any time after the 6 months and you are still a junior driver, if you have a crash or are convicted of a driving violation, the passenger restriction of only one passenger will be reinstated.
